Dear Chairman Wolf and Ranking Member Mollohan:

We respectfully urge the Science, State, Justice and Commerce Appropriations Subcommittee to assert its oversight role regarding the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission's (EEOC) Fiscal Year 2007 budget request. EEOC's budget request is approximately eight million dollars less than its Fiscal Year 2006 request, a four million drop from the budget EEOC has received over the past two years. We are writing to request that the subcommittee increase funds for frontline staffing rather than continuing to invest in controversial aspects of its field restructuring plan.

Since 2001, EEOC has lost over 575 employees, 20 percent of its workforce. Its field restructuring plan expands the jurisdictions of many offices that serve our constituents. Unfortunately, it has not supplied adequate staffing to assist with the additional workload. As a result, the number of cases EEOC is resolving is decreasing. EEOC's FY '07 budget request concedes that backlog, also known as "pending inventory," will grow "as a result of staff attrition." EEOC's own projections contend that their private sector charges backlog will rise from 33,562 in FY '05 to 47,516 in FY '07. EEOC cannot continue to shortchange its frontline resources.

We also urge the Subcommittee to retain oversight language in the appropriations bill ("the Commission may take no action to implement any workforce repositioning, restructuring, or reorganization until such time as the Committees on Appropriations have been notified of such provisions"). This language has been critical in allowing an opportunity for feedback from the public, civil rights groups as well as Congress. The oversight language remains essential as the commission continues to make changes to the field reorganization plan with respect to the organization of its field offices and its Headquarters.

Lastly, we ask that you reconsider allowing additional funding toward EEOC's bid to make its privatized call center permanent, particularly in light of EEOC's diminished budget request. For 40 years prior to the Pearson contract, questions from the public were handled by senior federal investigators. In place of local community-based experienced personnel, calls are being handled nationwide by distant operators with minimal on-the-job training.

The GAO study commissioned by your subcommittee found that EEOC had "no organized approach" in considering all restructuring options. Based on their conclusions, it would seem ill-advised to continually fund this plan as implemented. We are requesting simply that Congress provide the necessary funding for EEOC to get the job done right as well as help ensure the agency utilize its resources in the most cost-effective manner possible.
